FROM THE PRESIDENT, JOE LUTZ





To maximize the use of our property, we have had a planning committee working for the past few years to explore every possibility to get the most out of footprint. The hottest topic has been our own meeting/training center and the 385/500 range expansion.

The board has approved the layout of the building and we are in the process of getting the drawings and bids for construction. We are starting on the site preparation in the near future.

The new facility will be a combination of a large meeting/training room, bathrooms and maintenance facility. This has been on the want list since the inception of our club, and I am excited to be a part of it. Below is a layout:



This is an exciting time for our club. I have received many comments and concerns throughout this process and some good suggestions.

One comment I received had the most impact and I wish to share his words with you as I couldn't have spoken to them any better.

"I believe the majority of the membership is interested in promoting all disciplines of the shooting sports. Certainly, we all have our own special interests, but we are after all a shooting club. In recent years, Red Brush has made great improvements to our pistol bays. Fantastic! Those interested in utilizing the upgraded facilities are free to take advantage. I believe the vast majority of the club appreciates those upgrades despite a significant capital expenditure.

I am not privy to the details of the rifle range consolidation plan. At present, only one half of the 400/500-yard rifle range is available for daily use. I believe essentially doubling the rifle range area by combining the 400/500-yard ranges to one 500-yard line is a great idea. It will allow those who desire to utilize the wonderful new 500-yard line addition (as well as those who want to continue shooting shorter ranges), to do so at their leisure without the need of a special 500-yard line day.

Long range rifle shooting is one of the most popular and fastest growing shooting sports in the country. Red Brush is the only facility, as far as I'm aware, in the southern half of the state that has the capability of shooting at extended ranges. Why not put our best foot forward in utilizing the already available space to make a very nice rifle range even better? 
Update: Free Tool Available to Resolve Bolt Issue with Smith & Wesson M&P 15-22

In April 2019 Smith & Wesson announced a safety alert for all models of M&P15-22 rifles and pistols manufactured before February 1, 2019. Some bolts had been discovered to have been improperly manufactured which could lead to the firearm to fire upon closing (aka slam fire) and lead to multiple shots being fired without the trigger being depressed.

An M&P 15-22 should not be used until it has been inspected and the bolt replaced, if needed. Smith & Wesson has now made a free bolt inspection gauge tool available so you can inspect it yourself. Do Not Use Target Knock-Off Stands for Paper Targets or Centerfire Firearms!

Recently one of the range's knock-off target stands was severely damaged by improper use. It was used as a holder for paper targets and based on the impact marks, apparently was also hit by centerfire rounds. This means that the range will have to spend the money and time to replace or rebuild the entire stand.



This is unacceptable behavior. If you observe a member improperly using range equipment, please ask them to stop. If they don't, please contact a board member as soon as possible. The board will then act with an appropriate response including up to expulsion from the club.


Regarding proper use of the target knock-off stands, please remember that these stands are only to be use for items that fall off, such as bowling pins, cans, and plastic bottles. Place these items only on the wooden crossbeam. Please limit your use of the target knock off stands to rimfire cartridges only as centerfire calibers will destroy the wooden crossbeam quickly.

Be Aware of Caliber Restrictions

There have been reports of improper calibers being shot on Bays 1 and 2. Remember, outside of the very limited exceptions documented in the range rules, no bottleneck cartridges are to be shot on these bays. Yet, cases from .223, 7.62X39, and 17 HMR cartridges have recently been found on these bays. Shooting bottlenecked cartridges such as these on Bays 1 and 2 can lead to a suspension from the club.



For those who are unfamiliar with the term 'bottleneck' these are cartridges in which the case narrows so that its profile resembles a bottle (see picture). This allows for smaller, lighter bullets to be used with similar amounts of powder to the corresponding straight walled cartridge. The result is a significant increase in bullet velocity which, among other things, can damage the steel plates on Bays 1 and 2.



Also, please note that the 50 BMG cartridge, cartridges based on it (e.g., 416 Barrett, 408 CheyTac, 375 CheyTac), and more powerful cartridges than it is prohibited from use by the general membership across the entire range.

Also, I can still use electrical help so bring your gear.


I want to give a shout out to Mark Slow as I hoodwinked him into helping rebuild the tables on Bay3.

We have been busy with improvements to the range over the last month. All the gravel on the range has been leveled and compacted. Also, the turnaround on the 385 has been reworked and added some new gravel to the road.

A new swinging plate rack was recently installed on the 385-yard rifle bay. These AR500 ½" thick plates are 10, 8, 6, 5, 4, 3, & 2-inch circles. Please note, these should not be shot with Armor Piercing ammunition or ammunition with a muzzle velocity greater than 3200 fps. Thank you to Adam Leonberger for welding the carriages and to non-member Ron Straw for doing the on-site welding and installation. Work will be performed in the coming months to add similar plate racks to bays 1-5.

Red Brush IDPA TIER 2 Major Match - August 7, 2021

Bay Closure Schedule:

Monday, August 2nd – Beginning at 7am, bays 6-10 will be shut down to begin construction of stages. We will start on bay 10 and work toward bay 6, shutting each bay down as we get to it. Stage construction on these bays will continue Tuesday the 3rd.

Wednesday, August 4th – Beginning at 7am, bays 5 and 3 will be shut down for stage construction. Stage assembly on these two bays will likely happen at the same time.

Thursday, August 5th – Beginning at 7am, bay 2 will be shut down to begin stage construction. We will leave the shooting area for the plate rack open so bowling pin shooters can confirm zero.

Thursday Night: After the conclusion of the bowling pin match, bay 1 will be shut down for stage construction.

Friday, **August 6**th – Beginning at 7am, stage construction will be completed on bay 1 and the staff will shoot immediately following.

Saturday, **August** 7th – Main match will begin at 8am and conclude at approximately 4pm. After all scores have been entered and finalized the Awards and Prizes will be announced and will conclude tentatively by 6pm. Please note: These times are an estimation and are subject to change somewhat.

Sunday, **August 8**th – Match tear down will begin at 7am. We will start on bay 1 and work our around, clearing out our most used areas first. This process will likely begin after the conclusion of events Saturday evening.

Need to Know: Once bays are shut down for stage construction, they will remain shut down until the event is complete and the bay has been cleared of all match props. For the duration of the match, bay 4 will remain open for member use along with the rifle range.

Note: If permitted, we will consider coming in Sunday afternoon, August 1st, to begin setup on bays 9 and 10 if they are not in use. If possible, we would also like consideration for a workday credit to be awarded to any range member who is willing to come in on Sunday the 8th and assist with match tear down.
