FROM THE DNR, JIM MICHAUD

Members, the hunter education class has been set up for Saturday August 17th, from 08:00 to 16:00, and on Sunday August 18th, from 08:00 to about 13:00 or 14:00 depending on Class Size. The hunter education class allows future hunters to be able to hunt safely and is required to get an Indiana hunting license.

The current plan will be to use the new club house on these two days, and to do shooting on Sunday on Bay #2 for 22 rifles and Bay #10 for shotguns. This is rare in our area, as most DNR Hunter Education Classes do not do shooting.

Members Appreciation Night/Auction Night

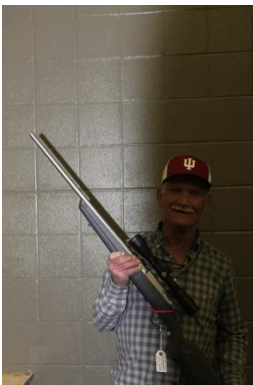

FROM THE RANGE OFFICER, FRANK FINDLEY

DO NOT SHOOT THE CONCRETE WALLS! DAMAGE FOUND TO BAY 6

In January 2023, we reported to the membership that the concrete walls on Bays 9 & 10 were damaged by rounds fired into them. We have now experienced similar damage to Bay 6 walls. This will cost the club resources to repair, money and time that otherwise could have been used for improvements.

Based on the evidence collected so far, the wall was repeatedly fired directly into with a firearm using a rifle cartridge. A target stand was present and placed at an angle which suggests that the person was shooting through the target directly into the wall.

As covered in the range rules, **targets should be placed so that rounds impact into the back berm, not into the side berms.** On bays 6 through 10 this is especially important given the nature of concrete walls, which is why the range rules have explicit instructions for target placement:

Section 19: Range Bay Specific Rules

B. General Purpose Bays

Bay #6, 7, 8, 9 and 10

Place all targets a minimum of six (6) feet from the concrete side walls when near the impact berm. If the target is placed closer to the firing line, make sure the target is placed so that a bullet will not pass through it and strike the concrete side wall. Look for a red post beside the walls on each side. Keep your targets inside the area between these posts.

Please note that this is considered a serious incident by the Board of Directors. As per Section 4, this could lead to a temporary suspension and even a loss of membership. Also, this constitutes property damage for which the range may seek reimbursement.

SMITH & WESSON ANNOUNCES RECALL OF RESPONSE RIFLE

Smith & Wesson has announced a safety recall of some Response Rifles manufactured before February 12, 2024. The effected rifles could have a dangerous out of battery discharge if the bolt were to fail to fully close and the trigger is pulled. Smith & Wesson is asking for owners to immediately stop using these rifles and to return them

RANGE SAFETY MONITOR PROGRAM IS BEING FULLY REACTIVATED

During the COVID pandemic, our range safety monitor program diminished as we could not meet as planned. We are now fully reactivating the program.

Who are the range safety monitors? They are Red Brush members who volunteer to once a month walk over the range checking for safety items and helping others. Here are some examples from the many positive things our Range Safety Monitors did:

- Helped a new member better understand his firearm and hearing protection.
- Identified an open, unmonitored gate.
- Relocated a shooter with an AR15 pistol from bay 1 to a bay appropriate for its caliber.
- Identified discharged fire extinguisher in member room.
- Found a lost spotting scope.
- Instructed a member on the proper line commands and use of the downrange lights.

Range Safety Monitors can also be called upon to monitor the gate during times when they need to be open for construction or other purposes.

BIOMETRICS GUN SAFE RECALL EXPANDED – OVER A HUNDRED THOUSAND BEING RECALLED

Last November we reported on the recall of Fortress brand safes after a lawsuit alleged that a 12-year old boy died from a firearm obtained from one of these safes due to a defect in the biometrics system. The recall has since expanded to other brands which used the same biometrics system. These safes were sold at numerous retailers including, but not limited to, Bass Pro Shops, Cabela's, Scheel's, Sportsman's Guide, Optics Planet, Walmart, Dick's Sporting Goods, Gander, Rural King, Lowe's, Amazon, and eBay. Project Appleseed Celebrates 18th Year at Red Brush with Special Patriots Day Shoot!

It has been 18 years since Project Appleseed began hosting classes at Red Brush. The first shoot had 157 participants and made the news, not only in Evansville but across the country. Every year thousands of people wanting to become more proficient with their rifles come to an Appleseed shoot. There they are taught safe handling, steady shooting positions, sling usage, the six steps of firing a shot, natural point of aim, and other skills necessary to hit standard size targets out to 500 yards. All this is done in a family-friendly, all-ages-welcomed manner without a 'boot camp' attitude.

But even more important than the marksmanship training, participants are exposed to stories of our country's founders and the sacrifices they made on April 19, 1775, at Lexington and Concord. The events of this day set the colonies on a course to become the United States of America. This history, which once was a staple of grade, middle, and high school curriculum, is barely touched upon in public schools these days!

Gunning for tradition

Event hopes to keep rifle skills in focus

On a grassy patch of land near Newburgh, a group of riflemen dropped to the ground and aimed their weapons at a target some 25 yards away.

Crouched side-by-side in a line, they stared straight ahead and waited for the order.

"Fire!" an instructor yelled.

Bullets zipped through the air, unleashing a series of pops like a finale at a fireworks show.

The scene, some at the Red Brush Rifle Range will say, is reminiscent of the days when America's founding fathers gathered to practice their marksmanship, a skill that would come in handy during the Revolutionary War.

But, in many families today, it's a skill that isn't passed down to future generations, said Jack Dailey of The Revolutionary War Veterans Association.

But Dailey hopes to reverse that trend through a series of programs he calls the Johnny Appleseed Tour. Dailey and several other rifle trainers began touring the country in February, giving two-day workshops on basic rifle skills and techniques.

The tour came to the Red Brush Rifle Range on Saturday, where more than 120 area riflemen participated. The tour will continue there today.

Dailey hopes the participants will return home and pass along the skills they learned, "planting seeds" for future generations.

Guns have received a bad rap in the mass media, and stories of the Revolutionary War aren't discussed as much in today's history classes, Dailey said.

"We've had several generations of good times," he said. "We have all the modern distractions of computers, computer games, TV, satellite TV, all this stuff. People aren't exposed to it. There's a rich history there."

The program was sponsored by the 2nd Amendment Patriots of Southwestern Indiana. Dailey is "trying to get the young people involved so we don't lose this art and tradition," group leader Jim Tomes said.

Support for the Second Amendment is strong in Indiana, Tomes said. The turnout for Saturday's program was by far the largest of any stop on the tour, he added.

Tomes and Dailey were encouraged to see people such as Joe Holbrook, a 14-year-old from Mount Vernon, Ind., who came with his grandfather, Tom Holbrook.

The younger Holbrook learned how to shoot a BB gun when he was 5 years old. His grandfather took him into the back yard and lined up empty soda cans as targets.

Five years later, Holbrook got his first rifle, a .22. He's been hunting with his grandfather ever since. Asked what he enjoys about shooting, Holbrook answered without hesitation, "Everything."
