# FROM THE RANGE OFFICER, FRANK FINDLEY

# Top of the Hour Mandatory Clear Period No Longer in Effect

The Board of Directors has rescinded the mandatory top of the hour clear period for the 400-yard bay. Given the substantive capacity of the range, there were very few circumstances when this mandatory clear period provided an advantage to the membership. Therefore, the following section of the range rules has been struck and is no longer in effect:

## • Section 19-C-6 Mandatory CLEAR Period at Top of the Hour [RESCINDED]

When the 400-yard rifle bay is open to the members for informal shooting, a mandatory ten-minute CLEAR time will be observed at the top of each hour (for example 1 PM to 1:10 PM, 2 PM to 2:10 PM, etc). During this time, the range will remain in a CLEAR status regardless if there are people downrange or not. Shortly before the top of each hour, all shooters on the bay must implement a CLEAR status as explained in section 11 B and activate the downrange alarm as explained in Section 18 E. Once the ten-minute period has expired and it is confirmed nobody is down range, the people on the 400-yard bay can go HOT by following the procedure of Section 11 A.

Given this change, please be attentive to other members coming to the 400-yard bay and provide an opportunity for them to set up following the procedures of Section 11-A.

#### 250 Year Anniversary of the Shot Heard Around the World!

April 19, 2025, marks the 250 Year Anniversary of the Battles of Lexington, Concord, and Menotomy. In 1775 the colonists of Massachusetts stood up to the British Regulars who were on a mission to disarm them and seize prominent members of the Sons of Liberty. Before they could implement their plans, silversmith Paul Revere, tanner William Dawes, and (later) physician Samuel Prescott, rode through the night warning each town militia. In the morning at the Lexington green, a group of 400 British light infantry fired upon the disbanding members of the town's militia of 77 men after a random shot rang out. 7 colonists were killed, and many others were wounded. Only one British regular was injured as the militiamen were in the process of leaving the field when they were fired upon. Later in the day at Concord, the British Regulars were met by 400 militiamen at the North Bridge. The British Regulars again fired on the militiamen, killing beloved Minuteman officer Isaac Davis. Isaac Davis, a gunsmith, had armed and trained his men to a very high level. Their return fire was so effective, the British Regulars broke ranks and retreated. Later in the day, the American Revolutionary War began when 6,000 Militiamen and British Regulars clashed at the town of Menotomy. By the end of the day, the entire British force found themselves nearly destroyed as they retreated to Boston. From this day forward, the armed American colonists banded together in the cause of Liberty.

This anniversary provides a wonderful opportunity to inform others about the events of this day and the war, especially the valiant acts of the colonists against overwhelming odds. At Red Brush, Project Appleseed will be having shoots where the story is told in more detail. And there are good articles in the gun magazines and forums, including one in the April issue of NRA's American Rifleman. These are well worth the read.

## **UPCOMING RANGE EVENTS INFORMATION**

- **Sub Gun Match, Sunday April 27**<sup>th</sup> is a week later than normal due to EASTER falling on the 3rd Sunday of the month, stage set up 10:30 on Bay 1, shooting starts at 12:00 noon. Pistol caliber sub-Guns only. We shoot paper and steel targets at 25 yards. Bring yours or come out to watch. Mike Maurer 812-305-2767.
- **Red Brush Steel Sun April 13** We shoot the 2nd Sunday of every month. The minimum number of rounds is 200.... if you don't miss. Standard safety equipment (eye pro, ear pro) required. If you shoot a .22 rifle or pistol you do not need a holster. Center fire pistols and revolvers require a holster. Your long gun, rifle or pcc, need to be cased. .22 pistols need to be cased.

Basic match format: there will be 6 or 8 stages. Each stage is 5 targets. Each stage is shot 5 times, with the slowest string being dropped. The farthest targets will be 35 yards. 7 of the 8 stages require no movement. One stage, outer limits, requires movement on the clock but you only move 6 feet.
