What Is 'Scope Bite' and How to Avoid It

We have had three reports from members of 'scope bite' over the last year so I thought it might be a good idea to bring it top-of-mind. Scope bite is a term used to describe the painful injury caused when a rifle's scope or sights hits a shooter's face-typically the area around the eve-during recoil. This usually happens when the shooter's eve is positioned too close to the scope, and the rifle's backward motion on firing causes the scope to hit the face. It often results in bruising, cuts, or even more serious injuries around the eye socket, hence the term



"scope bite" or "scope eye." See this video as an example: https://youtu.be/wVv8xrTrRJw

Avoiding scope bite comes down to a few key safety practices. First and foremost, always proper ensure eye relief-this is the safe distance between your eve and the rear lens of the scope. Most modern scopes have recommended eye relief distances, usually around 3 to 4 inches. Adjust the scope's position on the rifle so that you have a full sight picture without needing to lean in too close. Additionally, use shooting stance and grip



that helps control recoil effectively, especially with high-powered rifles. See this video when you don't have a Lastly, if the rifle has a collapsible stock make sure that it is extended to the length used for adjusting the scope position. Taking these precautions will help you shoot safely—and save your face from a painful bite.

As a final note, while scope bite usually occurs with a magnified optic, it can also occur with iron sights. For example, one of the recent instances at Red Brush occurred when an auxiliary tang sight was folded down.

Sig Sauer P320: Not Banned from Red Brush but May be Restricted by Certain Leagues

More calls and emails have been received on this topic than any other. For those who aren't aware, there have been several high-profile incidents which have brought into question the safety of the Sig Sauer P320 and military

variants such as the M18 pistol. Sig Sauer has released a statement on this here: https://www.sigsauer.com/blog/p320-information. Some shooting schools, organizations, and ranges have banned the use of the P320 while the investigations are ongoing.

Here is our status:

Members may continue to use the Sig Sauer P320 at the range. However, some Red Brush leagues and events may restrict their use. Please reach out to the league chair for information on its status.

This is consistent with incidents like this in the past. For example, in 2019 a dangerous issue arose with a small number of Smith & Wesson's M&P 15-22s. Due to a bolt manufacturing issue, these rifles could experience inadvertent discharges, the firing of multiple rounds with one pull of the trigger, and out-of-battery discharges. At that time, they were not banned from the range, but some leagues and trainers did forbid their use while the issue was being investigated and resolved.

The main issue with a general club ban is that it is difficult to know where to draw the line. Many historic firearms have far less safety features than the Sig Sauer P320. For example, the early Colt revolvers aren't drop safe, the sears can shear releasing the hammers causing the firearm to discharge. Yet, we had many years of them being safely used in cowboy action shooting league events and by the general membership. In the case of the Sig Sauer P320, the lack of definitive information makes it even harder to justify such a severe policy as a total ban.

Red Brush leagues and events have the authority to restrict equipment for any reason they deem necessary for the safety of their participants <u>and to maximize participation</u>. Potential safety issues with the Sig Sauer P320 have recently gained a lot of visibility in the media. Because of this, some individuals are reluctant to participate in events if these firearms are in use. Given this, leagues may choose to restrict the use of Sig Sauer P320 if their organizing bodies request it, it is believed they cannot be used safely, or their use is perceived to be a hurdle to getting people to participate.

History of the M1917 Enfield

The M1917 Enfield, "P17 Enfield", "American Enfield", formally named "United States Rifle, cal .30, Model of 1917" was an American modification and production of the British .303 caliber P14 rifle developed and manufactured during the period 1917-1918.

When the British Empire entered World War I, it had an urgent need for rifles and contracts were placed with companies in the United States. In the case of the P14 rifle, Winchester



and Remington were selected. When the U.S. entered the war, it had a similar extreme need for rifles. Rather than re-tool completely, the factories, under the close supervision of the US Army Ordnance Department, altered

the design for caliber .30-06. Winchester produced the rifle at their New Haven, Connecticut plant and Remington at their main facility at Ilion, New York and at another plant in Eddystone, Pennsylvania.

Customers can now order online in one place—just complete the form, upload eligibility documents, and submit. You'll *immediately* receive a confirmation email. Once your order is ready to process, we'll send you a unique code to log into the CMP eStore, confirm, and pay securely. Your order will then ship within a few days.



UPCOMING RANGE EVENTS INFORMATION

- 500-yard Precision Rifle Steel Open Member Days Wed Sep 10, 24: The 500-yard range will be open for members interested in shooting steel targets of various sizes at known distances. This will occur 1-3 weekdays per month. Set up will begin at 07:00 and break down at 11:30. These days will be posted on the calendar in the newsletter of the respective month. The 400-yard range will be closed during this time. We will do our best to coordinate this with the range schedule so that bay 4 is open for those interested in shooting paper etc. Eric Craig and Tom Ancona will be overseeing and acting as Range Officers' for the 500-range on these days. We encourage anyone interested in long range shooting to come out and get involved! It should be a fun time and learning opportunity for everyone who chooses to take part (regardless of experience). We do ask that you have your rifle zeroed prior. We will be shooting steel only and spotting target impacts from the firing line. The line will remain hot unless target failure or other necessary reasons to go cold.
- **Red Brush Steel Sun Sep 14:** We shoot the 2nd Sunday of every month. The minimum number of rounds is 200.... if you don't miss. Standard safety equipment (eye pro, ear pro) required. If you shoot a .22 rifle or pistol you do not need a holster. Center fire pistols and revolvers require a holster. Your long gun, rifle or pcc, need to be cased. .22 pistols need to be cased.

Basic match format: there will be 6 or 8 stages. Each stage is 5 targets. Each stage is shot 5 times, with the slowest string being dropped. The farthest targets will be 35 yards. 7 of the 8 stages require no movement. One stage, outer limits, requires movement on the clock but you only move 6 feet.
