Bullets Must be Kept on Range: Violations of Berm Safety Rules Likely to Lead to Expulsion from Club

Ensuring that all rounds fired stay safely on the shooting range is one of the most important responsibilities of any range operator. Proper back berms, side berms, and range designs not only protect shooters but also safeguard surrounding communities. When bullets escape a range, they pose serious risks to nearby homes, roads, and property—and even a single incident can erode public trust.

Several ranges have learned this lesson the hard way. In 2019, the Precision Gun Range in Spencer, Indiana, was ordered closed after neighbors reported stray rounds, prompting a court case and costly remediation:

Likewise, in Harvey, Illinois, a city range was shut down after bullets allegedly struck nearby yards and a home:

These examples show that containment failures can quickly lead to permanent range closure, legal battles, and community backlash. Maintaining strict control of every round fired is essential not just for safety, but for preserving the future of responsible marksmanship and public confidence in local shooting sports.

For these reasons, going forward my recommendation to the Board of Directors will be expulsion from the club for any of the following rule's violations:

- Placing target stands on berms (either back or side). This defeats the safety margin provided by their height.
- Shooting at ground targets close to the firing line. This can lead to rounds skipping over the berm.
- Shooting at aerial targets with anything other than shotguns.

If you observe any shooter setting up for any of these conditions, please ask them to immediately stop. Thank you for your help in this matter.

Glock Discontinuing Most Current Models, Launching New Generation V Models

Please be aware that Glock is discontinuing most of its current pistol models. These discontinuations are not for safety reasons but "in order to focus on the products that will drive future innovation and growth." Reading between the lines, this is likely because these Glock models have been banned in California over claims that they are easily convertible to full auto operation:

The NRA has already sued California to overturn this ban: https://townhall.com/tipsheet/scott-mcclallen/2025/10/15/glock-ban-sparks-nra-lawsuit-against-governor-newsom-n2664961. But it is unlikely a ruling will come prior to the ban going into effect in July of 2026. So, Glock may have decided to speed up release of its Generation V models, which are reportedly harder to convert, thereby regaining access to the Californian market.

But it still may be wise to buy spare parts as they will likely become more expensive as manufacturing shifts to the new generation.

UPCOMING RANGE EVENTS INFORMATION

- **500-yard Precision Rifle Steel Open Member Days Sun Nov 30:** The 500-yard range will be open for members interested in shooting steel targets of various sizes at known distances. This will occur 1-3 weekdays per month. Set up will begin at 07:00 and break down at 11:30. These days will be posted on the calendar in the newsletter of the respective month. The 400-yard range will be closed during this time. We will do our best to coordinate this with the range schedule so that bay 4 is open for those interested in shooting paper etc. Eric Craig and Tom Ancona will be overseeing and acting as Range Officers' for the 500-range on these days. We encourage anyone interested in long range shooting to come out and get involved! It should be a fun time and learning opportunity for everyone who chooses to take part (regardless of experience). We do ask that you have your rifle zeroed prior. We will be shooting steel only and spotting target impacts from the firing line. The line will remain hot unless target failure or other necessary reasons to go cold.
- **Red Brush Steel Sun Nov 9:** We shoot the 2nd Sunday of every month. The minimum number of rounds is 200.... if you don't miss. Standard safety equipment (eye pro, ear pro) required. If you shoot a .22 rifle or pistol you do not need a holster. Center fire pistols and revolvers require a holster. Your long gun, rifle or pcc, need to be cased. .22 pistols need to be cased.

Basic match format: there will be 6 or 8 stages. Each stage is 5 targets. Each stage is shot 5 times, with the slowest string being dropped. The farthest targets will be 35 yards. 7 of the 8 stages require no movement. One stage, outer limits, requires movement on the clock but you only move 6 feet.
